The Society

The Landscape of Grand Pré Society was incorporated in May 2013 to replace the Stewardship Board committee of the former Kings Regional Development Authority (RDA).

The goals of the Society are to:

- ensure the conservation, protection, presentation and transmission to future generations, of the property's Outstanding Universal Value, through implementation of the Landscape of Grand Pré World Heritage Site Management Plan;
- provide advice to ensure the integrity of the World Heritage Site through a coordinated management approach between all Regulatory Authorities;
- **promote** the World Heritage Site's Outstanding Universal Value;
- engage stakeholders in the stewardship of the World Heritage Site;
 and
- report to UNESCO on the condition of the World Heritage Site.

The Stewardship Board

The Society's Board of Directors (the Stewardship Board) is composed of organizations with jurisdiction and/or primary interest in some part of the Landscape of Grand Pré.

While the Board itself has no jurisdiction, the mandate of the Board is to facilitate information sharing, partnerships and co-ordinate technical expertise, as well as to promote the site through marketing and education.

The Stewardship Board has been working together since October 2012 in a collaborative environment. The Board intends to use its website at www.landscapeofgrandpre.ca as the primary communication vehicle.

The Board has approved a lease beginning September 2013 with Just Us! Coffee for local office space for the Site Management Co-ordinator.

Support Services

The Board has awarded some year-long professional services contracts: Shablizzam Interactive Studios for website management, Sagehouse Design for adminstrative support (both based in Grand Pré) and Equilibrium Business Services, Gaspereau, for financial support services. Translation contracts have been awarded to France Blanchard and Ginette White of Moncton.

BOARD MEETINGS

Board meetings are open to the public and are held locally. Meetings are announced on www.landscapeofgrandpre.ca Past meeting agendas and approved meeting minutes are also posted on the website.







With the loss of support services from the Kings RDA, the Board publicly called for the provision of administration, website management, financial and translation services. Municipal staff reviewed submissions and contracts were awarded following incorporation of the Society.

The Stewardship Board is currently establishing its **2 Major Committees** to focus on **Marketing/Promotion/Education** and for coordinating all **Technical Advice**, as required under the commitment to UNESCO. Board Activities

At the April board meeting, Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture staff responsible for marshland protection and the dykes provided a presentation to enable an enhanced understanding of the dykes and ongoing challenges relating to the protection of the dykelands. This presentation enabled the Stewardship Board to begin to consider how best to communicate issues around the privately-owned dykelands of the World Heritage Site.

Jonathan Fowler, archaeologist, Saint Mary's University, provided a presentation focussed on the challenges and opportunities relating to the management and conservation of archaeological heritage in the Landscape of Grand Pré World Heritage Site. There will now be a formal dialogue initiated between the Stewardship Board and Saint Mary's University to define a continuing partnership for archaeology in the area.

The Co-Chairs provide the Board's first Annual Update, June 18th 2013, to the Council Committee of the Whole, Municipality of the County of Kings.

Other continuing and future work of the Stewardship Board includes:

- Hiring of the first Site Manager Coordinator.
- Developing both interior and exterior interpretative material for the Visitor Centre at the Grand Pré National Historic Site.
- Distribution of the new brochure to Nova Scotia visitor information centres and Parks Canada sites in Atlantic Canada.
- Expansion of the Landscape of Grand Pré website as a portal for all information, including links to new publications about Grand Pré
- Share work and budget with the funding partners.
- Participate, with other community members, in Nova Scotia's annual Heritage Conference, focusing this year on Cultural Landscapes.
- Participate with municipal staff, in the planned County of Kings Signage Study.

Funding partners

The Landscape of Grand Pré UNESCO World Heritage Trust was established in November 2012, with a \$2.5 million endowment from the Government of Nova Scotia. Over 10 years, the Trust will provide support to:

- provide for the protection, continuing community and agricultural use and appreciation of the site;
- enrich the existing tourism destination by promoting wide recognition, understanding and appreciation of the values represented by the site;
- **instill** a strong sense of shared community pride and stewardship in the protection, interpretation and promotion of the site;
- **foster** increased economic, tourism and agricultural opportunities through partnerships at the site; and
- **ensure** the long-term sustainability of the site's governance.

The Members of the Grand Pré Trust are Peter Herbin and Robert Palmeter of Grand Pré, with Marie-Paul LaForge of Halifax.

The Municipality of the County of Kings is contributing \$30000 annually to the work of the Landscape of Grand Pré World Heritage Site.
